



Gospel reflection ~ Matthew 5:1-12a

Today's Gospel presents us with the Beatitudes, Jesus's blueprint for genuine happiness and Kingdom living. How countercultural these teachings must have sounded to the crowds gathered on that mountainside—and how countercultural they remain today. Christ calls blessed not the powerful, the wealthy, or the self-assured, but the poor in spirit, the meek, and those who hunger for righteousness. In a world that prizes strength and success, Jesus reveals that true blessedness comes through humility, mercy, and purity of heart. The Beatitudes challenge us to examine our own lives: Do we seek God's kingdom above earthly comfort? Are we willing to be peacemakers in our families and communities, even when it costs us? As we reflect on these eight pathways to holiness, let us ask the Lord for the grace to embrace His paradoxical wisdom—to find our deepest joy not in what we accumulate or achieve, but in becoming poor enough to receive everything from His loving hands. May we have the courage this week to live at least one of these Beatitudes more intentionally, trusting that Jesus's promise of blessing is true.

Dear St. Bernadette Congregation,
Thank you so very much for your recent donation. Your generosity will help us provide services for veterans who need support but cannot find it elsewhere.

While we do many services one-on-one, we also host events that benefit veterans and their families. For example, in June we had a Bikes for Stripes Resource Fair where almost 200 veterans attended. We distributed 163 refurbished bikes and bike locks to veterans, spouses, and their children. We also held our first Drive-Through Food Drive, where we collected 1900Lbs of food to restock our Emergency Food Pantry.

We had our Back-to-School Fair in August, a Wellness Event for Women Veterans in October, as well as our Holiday Giveaway event in December.

Lastly, we started a new Facebook page. If you are not yet a follower or if you are still following our old page, please check out Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative - SEW and like, follow, and share our page. It's where you will be kept up to date on the many events, successes, and exciting opportunities MHVI has.

Since our founding in 2008, MHVI has run solely on donations from individuals, businesses, foundations, and the community. This year is no exception. We sincerely appreciate all you have done to help move MHVI forward and become a safe and trusted space for veterans in need.

Bag lunch ministry update

Since October 2020, our parish communities have prepared around 100 bag lunches each month for the MacCannon Brown Homeless Sanctuary. Thanks to your generosity, we have provided 6,061 lunches to date—a remarkable achievement made possible by your ongoing support. Your outreach contributions allow us to purchase all the essentials that go into each lunch: bread, lettuce, meat, peanut butter and jelly, mustard, fresh fruit, cookies, chips, bottled water, sandwich bags, and brown lunch bags.

Each month, volunteers from all three parishes gather on the second Tuesday at 9:00AM at StB to prepare, assemble, and deliver the lunches. We are deeply grateful for your continued generosity. For many of our brothers and sisters experiencing hardship, this may be the only meal they receive that day.

As we begin a new year, we invite you to continue supporting this ministry. Here's how you can help:

- Volunteer at our monthly gathering to prepare lunches
- Donate needed items:
 - ⇒ Sandwich-size flip-top baggies
 - ⇒ Snack-size zipper baggies
 - ⇒ Peanut butter (please avoid chunky or varieties with oil separation)
 - ⇒ Jam or jelly
 - ⇒ Spicy mustard

Please clearly label all donations "Bag Lunches" and leave them in any of the church lobbies.
