Gospel reflection: Third Sunday of Advent

Even John the Baptist, the fearless prophet who boldly proclaimed the coming Messiah, experienced moments of doubt from the darkness of his prison cell. His question— "Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?"—echoes the honest uncertainties that arise in our own hearts when circumstances don't unfold as we expected. Jesus doesn't rebuke John's doubt; instead, He responds with evidence of His kingdom breaking into the world: the blind see, the lame walk, the poor hear good news. This Third Sunday of Advent reminds us that faith doesn't mean the absence of questions, but rather bringing those questions directly to Jesus and watching for His response in the transformation happening around us. The Messiah John announced didn't come as a conquering warrior but as a healer of broken bodies and hearts, challenging our assumptions about how God works in the world. Jesus honors John as the greatest born of women, yet declares that even the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater—a stunning promise that God's grace elevates us beyond what any human achievement could accomplish. As we light the third Advent candle of joy, we're invited to rejoice not because our circumstances are perfect, but because God is faithfully at work even when we can't fully see or understand His ways. In our own prisons of worry, disappointment, or confusion, may we follow John's example: bring our honest doubts to Jesus and wait with open eyes for the signs of His kingdom all around us.

A Christmas Message: Coming Together in Hope

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we approach this holy season, I want to speak directly to what many of you may be feeling about our Christmas Day celebration. This year, we will gather together as one community at St. Margaret Mary Parish for our Christmas Day Mass, rather than celebrating at each of our individual parish sites.

I know this decision brings mixed emotions, and I want you to know that I hear you and understand your concerns.

For our beloved parishioners of St. Catherine of Alexandria and Our Lady of Good Hope, this Christmas may carry particular weight. The thought that this might be among your last Christmas celebrations in these sacred spaces—churches where you were baptized or married, where you've mourned loved ones and rejoiced in countless blessings—brings a very real sadness. These walls hold your prayers, your memories, and generations of faith. The grief of potentially losing your sacred space is not something to dismiss lightly, and I acknowledge how difficult this is.

Yet even in this difficulty, I ask you to consider what we are moving toward, not just what we may be leaving behind.

The decision to celebrate Christmas Day together at one site is not about convenience or logistics alone. It is an invitation—an invitation to experience something we have not fully known before: the strength and joy of true unity. By bringing together the choirs, musicians, and faithful from all five parishes, we will create a celebration that reflects the fullness of who we are becoming. We are not five separate communities that have a common geographic location; we are one family in Christ, learning to recognize ourselves in one another.

This Christmas gathering is a practice run for our future. As we face the reality of merging communities, we must learn to move freely among our neighboring parishes, to see beyond "my church" to "our Church." The Christmas story itself is about God breaking through barriers—heaven touching earth, divine meeting human, shepherds and kings worshiping side

by side. Our coming together embodies that same spirit of unexpected unity.

I understand that change, especially when it touches the places most sacred to us, can feel like loss. But I believe that the future holds more promise when we gather together as one than when we remain separate. In our unity, we find strength. In our shared worship, we discover renewed purpose. In our willingness to journey together, we honor the Christ child who came to gather all people to himself.

This Christmas, as we join our voices in one sanctuary, we are choosing hope over fear, communion over isolation, and a shared future over a fragmented past. We are saying yes to something larger than any one of us or any single parish community.

I invite you to come with open hearts. Greet someone you don't know. Sit beside someone from another parish. Let the music wash over you—the combined voices of our choirs, the harmonies we can only make together. See in this gathering a glimpse of the kingdom of God, where all are welcome and all belong.

The road ahead may not be easy, but we do not walk it alone. We walk it together, guided by the light of Christ, who was born to bring us home to one another and to God.

May this Christmas be for all a celebration of Emmanuel—God with us—and may we be for each other a sign of God's abiding presence.
