#### Gospel reflection

In today's gospel, Jesus speaks sobering words about the destruction of the Temple and the trials His followers will face. While the disciples marvel at the Temple's beauty, Jesus sees beyond the stones to remind us that earthly grandeur is temporary. His prophecy of wars, earthquakes, and persecution isn't meant to frighten us, but to prepare us for discipleship in a world that often resists God's truth. Jesus promises that even when we're brought before authorities or betrayed by loved ones, He will give us the words and wisdom we need. The assurance that "not a hair of your head will be destroyed" speaks to God's intimate care for us, even when circumstances seem overwhelming. Our call is to persevere, trusting that God works through our witness, especially in difficult times. These trials become opportunities to testify to the hope that cannot be shaken by earthly turmoil. By our endurance, Jesus promises, we will secure our lives—not in worldly safety, but in the eternal security of God's love.



#### Thank you for your generosity to Honduras

Dear parishioners,

I am overwhelmed with gratitude as I write to thank you for the extraordinary outpouring of generosity for our recent Honduras mission collection. This donation represents the largest collection of items ever sent from the Northwest Milwaukee Catholic Parishes, combined with the wonderful contributions from Queen of Apostles Parish.

Your response to the call to help our brothers and sisters in Honduras was nothing short of miraculous. Together, we collected and sent:

- 169 banana boxes of clothing
- 30 banana boxes of healthcare items
- 24 banana boxes of shoes
- 21 banana boxes and 7 large boxes of toys
- 15 walkers, 5 wheelchairs, 4 shower chairs, and 3 strollers
- 6 banana boxes of school supplies
- and so much more, including household items, blankets, tools, and even a bicycle and Christmas tree

The volume of donations was so great that we filled an entire large truck and an additional trailer. These items were delivered to the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse in New Holstein on October 13th, where they will be loaded into a 40-foot container for their journey to Honduras. There they will bring hope, dignity, and practical help to families living in some of the most remote and underserved communities.

To the Northwest Milwaukee Catholic Parishes, I offer special thanks for your generous financial donations through the Mission Appeal in August. Your contributions will go directly to help the poor in their need, for as Pope Leo XIV reminds us in his new apostolic exhortation *Dilexi te*, "No Christian can regard the poor simply as a societal problem; they are part of our 'family.' They are 'one of us." Your financial support enables us to provide lifesaving surgical procedures, essential medical supplies, and humanitarian aid to those who have nowhere else to turn.

A special thank you to Margaret Thorn as well as all the dedicated volunteers who sorted, boxed, labeled, packed, and transported these items. Your countless hours of work made this possible.

To everyone who cleaned out closets, donated items, and thought of our Honduran brothers and sisters, your generosity speaks volumes about the compassion in your hearts. Every pair of shoes, every walker, every toy, and every healthcare item represents Christ's love reaching across borders to touch lives in profound ways.

As we prepare for our February mission trip, please keep the people of Honduras in your prayers. Your gifts will make a real difference in their lives.
