Update to collections at joint Mass celebrations

When St. Bernadette, Blessed Savior, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and Our Lady of Good Hope are celebrating holidays and holy days as one community, the joint collection is handled as follows: All envelopes dropped in the collection basket will be sorted at the parish where the collection was taken. Envelopes and loose checks will be transferred to the parish designated either on the pay to line of the check or by the envelope assignment. Any loose change/bills or any cash in an envelope not designated for a parish will be divided evenly among the four parish communities. For Assumption, a contribution placed into the collection at St. Margaret Mary that is intended to be transferred to another parish must be directed to the intended parish on the pay to line of your check or by envelope assignment.

If you are visiting from one of our collaborating parishes, envelopes are available in the back of our church for your cash offering so that you can designate which parish the funds should be transferred to.



A Reflection on Luke 12:32-48

In this passage, Jesus speaks tenderly to his disciples as a "little flock," assuring them of the Father's desire to give them the kingdom. This intimate language reminds us that we are cherished by God, called to trust rather than fear as we navigate life's uncertainties. Jesus then challenges us to live with open hands, selling possessions and giving to the poor, demonstrating that our treasure lies not in earthly security but in our relationship with God. The parable of the watchful servants reveals the Christian posture of active waiting-not passive inactivity, but purposeful readiness for Christ's return.

The master's promise to serve those who remain faithful turns worldly expectations upside down, showing God's generous heart toward those who persevere in their calling. Peter's question about the audience for these teachings leads to Jesus' sobering reminder that leadership brings greater responsibility and accountability. The faithful steward who cares well for others receives reward, while the one who abuses authority faces severe consequences. Ultimately, this passage calls each of us to examine our hearts: Are we storing up treasure in heaven through generous love, remaining vigilant in our faith, and faithfully stewarding whatever responsibilities God has entrusted to us?


