Update to collections at joint Mass celebrations

When St. Bernadette, Blessed Savior, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and Our Lady of Good Hope are celebrating holidays and holy days as one community, the joint collection is handled as follows: All envelopes dropped in the collection basket will be sorted at the parish where the collection was taken. Envelopes and loose checks will be transferred to the parish designated either on the pay to line of the check or by the envelope assignment. Any loose change/bills or any cash in an envelope not designated for a parish will be divided evenly among the four parish communities. For Assumption, a contribution placed into the collection at St. Margaret Mary that is intended to be transferred to another parish must be directed to the intended parish on the pay to line of your check or by envelope assignment.

If you are visiting from one of our collaborating parishes, envelopes are available in the back of our church for your cash offering so that you can designate which parish the funds should be transferred to.



Beyond the Barns: A Reflection on Luke 12:13-21

In Luke 12:13-21, Jesus confronts our culture's obsession with material security through the parable of a wealthy man who built bigger barns to store his abundant harvest. The rich man's fatal mistake was not his prosperity itself, but his assumption that accumulating possessions could guarantee his future and provide ultimate security. Jesus calls this man a "fool" because he failed to recognize that life's true meaning cannot be found in the abundance of things we own or control. The parable reveals how easily we can become so focused on storing up earthly treasures that we neglect our relationship with God and our responsibility to others. When we place our trust in material possessions rather than in God's provision, we risk becoming spiritually impoverished even amid physical wealth. The rich man's sudden death serves as a stark reminder that our earthly goods are temporary and cannot accompany us beyond this life. Jesus challenges us to examine our own hearts and ask whether we are "rich toward God" or merely accumulating possessions that will ultimately pass away. True security comes not from what we have stored in our barns, but from our trust in God's faithful provision and our willingness to share generously with others. The passage calls us to hold our material blessings lightly, recognizing them as gifts from God to be stewarded wisely rather than hoarded selfishly. As we reflect on this teaching, may we choose to invest in eternal treasures—acts of love, service, and faithfulness that will endure long after our earthly possessions have turned to dust. ~Fr. Thank you so very much for your recent donation. Your generosity will help us provide services for veterans who need support but who cannot find it elsewhere.

Every year MHVI sees more veterans than in the previous year and 2024 was no exception. We served 1,432 veterans, with 194 of those being female veterans. We also serve family members of veterans. Last year we helped 243 couples and 403 children in crisis. Not only are we seeing increasing numbers, but the complexity of the issues veterans face is also increasing.

For example, we have veterans who are grandparents who have never needed services before. But they find themselves as unexpected guardians of their grandchildren and need help. We not only provide furniture, car seats, food, bedding, toys, and diapers, but we help them navigate systems to get their grandchildren services.

Since our founding in 2008, MHVI has run solely on donations from individuals, businesses, foundations, and the community. This year is no exception. We sincerely appreciate all you have done to help move MHVI forward and become a safe and trusted space for veterans in need.
