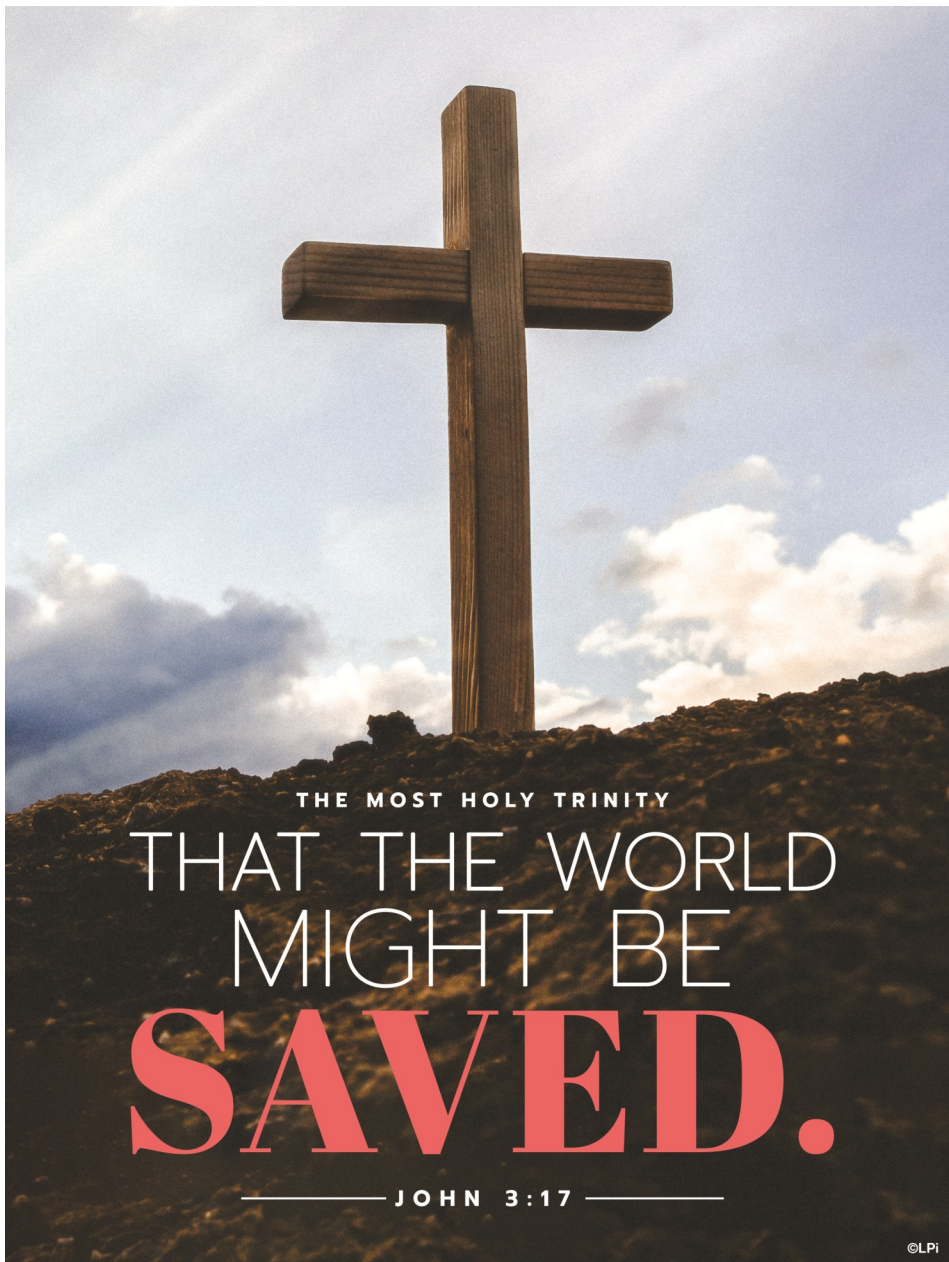

Columbarium decoration policy

The StCA columbarium is a sacred site. To that end, no objects (flowers, signs, mementos, etc.) should be placed on the engraved face of any niche. Flowers and other mementos may be placed at the base of the columbarium as long as they are appropriate for the cemetery and in good condition. After June 14, objects on the face of any niche will be removed and disposed of by cemetery staff.

Gospel Reflection: John 3:16-18

On this Trinity Sunday, we gather around one of Scripture's most beloved verses, a passage so familiar it can still surprise us with its depth. John 3:16 opens with three simple words, "For God so loved," reminding us that everything begins not with our striving, but with the boundless, self-giving love of the Father. This love is not abstract or distant; it took the concrete, costly form of the Son, the Word made flesh, given for the life of the world. The word "gave" echoes throughout the entire story of salvation, from creation to cross to empty tomb, revealing a God who holds nothing back. Yet today we are also reminded that this love is offered to the world not just to the worthy or the righteous, but to all of humanity in its brokenness and need. The promise of eternal life is not a reward we earn, but a gift we receive through trust in the One whom the Father sent. Verses 17 and 18 gently correct any fear that God came to condemn. Christ entered the world not as judge, but as Savior, bearing the weight of judgment so we would not have to. As we celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity today—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—may we rest in the astonishing truth that this triune God is, above all else, love poured out for us.

Bingo volunteers needed

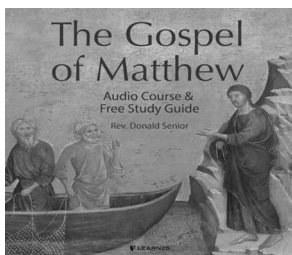

Archdiocesan donations

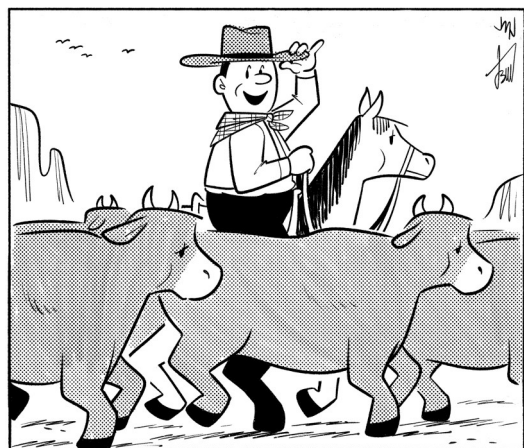
