Gospel reflection: John 1:29-34

John the Baptist's proclamation of Jesus as "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" marks a pivotal moment in salvation history, connecting the sacrificial system of the Old Testament to its ultimate fulfillment in Christ. In these verses, John testifies to what was revealed to him at Jesus' baptism: the Spirit descending and remaining upon Jesus, confirming His identity as the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit. The Baptist's humility shines through as he acknowledges his own role was simply to prepare the way and bear witness to the one far greater than himself. His testimony reminds us that true discipleship involves pointing others toward Jesus rather than drawing attention to ourselves. The image of the Lamb evokes both the Passover lamb whose blood protected Israel and the suffering servant of Isaiah who bore our iniquities. John's declaration that he "has seen and testified" challenges us to reflect on our own encounters with Christ and how we share that witness with others. The Spirit's descent and remaining upon Jesus assures us that in Him we find not a temporary presence but an abiding source of grace and power. As we hear John's testimony anew, we're invited to look upon Jesus with fresh eyes and proclaim with conviction: "This is the Son of God."

Annual Report: St. Vincent de Paul-St. Bernadette Conference

Who Are We?

Our membership consists of five active and several associate members. We serve in a geographic area determined by the Milwaukee Council of St. Vincent de Paul, currently the St. Bernadette and Our Lady of Good Hope Parish boundaries, welcoming people of all religious beliefs.

What Do We Do?

We try to follow in the footsteps of our founder, Blessed Frederic Ozanam, in the spirit of St. Vincent de Paul, in seeing to the dignity of the human person. Through home visits, we assess the needs of those who come to us. Most are living at poverty level or are having temporary difficulty in providing for their families. We try to meet their needs directly or by referrals to other community resources.

Why Do We Do It?

We share a desire to live out our religious convictions, to go out and love and serve each other as taught and lived by Jesus Christ, the greatest servant of all time.

Where Do We Get Our Funding and Support?

Most of our funding comes from our St. Vincent de Paul Milwaukee Council's "Neighbors Helping Neighbors" program. The amount of funds available depends on the success of our StVdP Thrift Stores. Other funds come from bequests to StVdP, or various grants our Council applies for. We are grateful for donations from the parishioners of St. Bernadette and Our Lady of Good Hope, as well as their donations in our lobby poor boxes. We also accept donations of gently-used furniture and appliances to save the cost of issuing

vouchers. The Sharing Trees at Christmas provides gift cards to supply basic care needs of cleaning and hygiene items, or items not available at the thrift stores.

Who Did We Serve This Last Year?


We served 905 brothers and sisters in need with food, clothing, furniture, appliances, gift cards, or other help. We made 306 home visits last year. Goods and services given to those in need totaled approximately \$69,302, representing 1,125 hours of service. We reached out to all referrals received through home visits and phone visits.
